A PROCLAMATION

By the Governor

WHEREAS, National Fire Prevention Week, being observed in Two Thousand Nineteen from the sixth day of October through the twelfth day of October, is the longest-running public health and safety observance on record; and

WHEREAS, a presidential proclamation was issued on the fourth day of October, Two Thousand Nineteen, ordering that all United States flags be flown at half-staff on all federal office buildings on the sixth day of October, Two Thousand Nineteen, in honor of the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Service.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM JUSTICE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as the Governor of the State of West Virginia, do hereby **ORDER** that all United States and State flags on all State facilities throughout the State shall be flown at half-staff the entire day of Sunday, the sixth day of October, Two Thousand Nineteen; and

DO FURTHER call upon the citizens of West Virginia to participate in appropriate ceremonies to honor our fire and emergency services personnel and their invaluable service to our communities in remembrance of those who made the ultimate sacrifice.
