Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *October 6-12, 2020* as:

National Physician Assistants Week

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to recognize the significant impact PAs have made and continue to make in healthcare as a critical part of the healthcare team.
