## **A PROCLAMATION**

# By the Governor

WHEREAS, Shirley D. Love was born on the Fifteenth day of May, Nineteen Hundred Thirty-three, in Oak Hill, West Virginia, the son of Earl Clinton and Winona May Hall Love; and

WHEREAS, Shirley Love worked for WOAY-TV in Oak Hill as a broadcaster from Nineteen Hundred Fifty-four to Nineteen Hundred Ninety-seven and was well known as an announcer for Saturday Night Wrestling; and

WHEREAS, Shirley Love was elected to the West Virginia Senate in Nineteen Hundred Ninety-four representing the Eleventh Senatorial District and later served in the West Virginia House of Delegates; and

WHEREAS, Senator Shirley Love, a committed and respected public servant and a devoted son, husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle, friend, and neighbor, died on the Seventeenth day of July, Two Thousand Twenty; and

WHEREAS, Senator Shirley Love is survived by his wife, Audrey Painter Love; son, James "Jimmy" Love IV; daughter Christie Love and companion Judy Fitzgerald; grandchildren, James Love V and companion Mary Nell and also Sarah Love who is the mother of James' children, Matthew (Allison) Love, Robert (Amanda) Love, Benjamin (Tiffany) Love, Mary Beth (Pete) Knight, and Michael Love and companion Lauren Satyshur; 11 grandchildren; sister, Margaret Ann Painter; special friends, Dave Perry, Joe Shelton, William Laird, and the Syner Family; caretakers Raymond Frye and Family, and the Donnelly Family; he was preceded in death by a son, Dr. Brian Stephen Love; sisters Earline Treadway, Loraine Minnix, and Ruth Vegh; and brother James Love III; and
