# **A PROCLAMATION**

#### By the Governor

WHEREAS, National Fire Prevention Week, being observed from October 3, 2021 through October 9, 2021, is the longest-running public health and safety observance on record; and

WHEREAS, a presidential proclamation was issued on October 1, 2021, ordering that all United States flags be flown at half-staff on all federal office buildings on October 3, 2021, in honor of the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Service.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM JUSTICE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as the Governor of the State of West Virginia, do hereby ORDER that all United States and State flags on all State facilities throughout the State shall be flown at half-staff the entire day of Sunday, October 3, 2021; and

**DO FURTHER** call upon the citizens of West Virginia to participate in appropriate ceremonies to honor our fire and emergency services personnel and their invaluable service to our communities in remembrance of those who made the ultimate sacrifice.
