Proclamation by Governor Jim Justice

Whereas, in 2022, childhood cancer is the leading cause of death by disease in children under the age of 19 in the United States; and

Whereas, in the United States forty-seven children, between ages birth through age 19, will be diagnosed with cancer every day, totaling more than 17,293 children, and in West Virginia, there are more than seventy-five; children treated at WVU Children's Hospital in Morgantown; Edwards Comprehensive Cancer Center at Hoops Children's Hospital/Cabell Huntington Hospital in Huntington and CAMC Children's Cancer Center with physician services provided by WVU Physicians of Charleston; and

Whereas, even though the childhood cancer community is making remarkable breakthroughs in cancer treatments and improving survival rates, nationally about 1 in 285 children will develop cancer before the age of 20.1,600 children and adolescents are expected to die from cancer in 2022; and

Whereas, childhood cancer occurs regularly, randomly and spares no ethnic group, socioeconomic class, or geographic region. The overall incidence of childhood cancer is on the increase; and

Whereas, a childhood cancer diagnosis is a family diagnosis and is a tremendous emotional and financial burden for the family and child to bear; on average, cancer costs almost five times as much as hospitalizations for other pediatric conditions; and

Whereas, only four percent of the federal government's total funding for cancer research is dedicated to childhood cancers each year. Today we have only SIX drugs that were approved in the first instance for use in cancer treatment for children; and

Whereas,
National Childhood Cancer Awareness Month recognizes the courage and compassion of those children, adolescents and their families throughout West Virginia and the nation who have, are currently battling childhood cancer; and

Whereas, all children and adolescents affected by cancer, their families, medical professionals, caregivers, and friends join West Virginia Kids Cancer Crusaders, Inc., to continue to unite collaborative efforts through providing a support network, raising awareness and funds for those affected by childhood cancer, and making a positive difference for patients, families, and survivors in the future.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim September 2022 as:

National Childhood Cancer Awareness Month

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in this observance.
