Whereas, there are nearly 6,500 children in West Virginia's foster care program and more than 400,000 nationwide who require the achievement of permanency, which for some will be through an adoptive family; and

Whereas, all children deserve a lifetime of love and stability through a "forever" family; and

Whereas, providing a safe and nurturing environment for West Virginia's children ensures they can reach their full potential as the next generation of West Virginia leaders, helping to secure the future of this state and nation; and

Whereas, the collaboration of both public and private adoption agencies with the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources, community agencies, religious organizations, businesses, resource/ foster families, and others should be recognized for the commitment to meeting the needs of children in West Virginia; and

Whereas, Adoptive parents, children and families require and deserve community and public recognition, respect and support.


Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim November 2022 as:
