Proclamation by Governor Jim Justice

Whereas, the liver is one of the largest organs in the body and filters harmful substances from the blood, produces bile that helps in the digestion of fats, and stores sugar that the body uses for energy; and

Whereas, the two types of primary liver cancer in adults are hepatocellular carcinoma and cholangiocarcinoma; and

Whereas, the National Cancer Institute's Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) Program estimates that 41,210 new cases of liver and intrahepatic bile duct cancer will be diagnosed in the United States in 2023; and

Whereas, 29,380 people are expected to die of primary adult liver cancer where the five-year relative survival rate is just 21.6 %; and

Whereas, having hepatitis B, hepatitis C, or cirrhosis are significant risk factors for adult primary liver cancer; and

Whereas, liver cancer is more common in men than women and among Asian Pacific Islander and American Indian Alaska Native populations; and

Whereas, liver cancer is rare in children and adolescents; and

Whereas, the American Association for Cancer Research designates October to be *Liver Cancer Awareness Month* to bring awareness and treat liver cancer.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *October 2023* as:

Liver Cancer Awareness Month

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in observance.
