Proclamation by Governor Jim Justice

Whereas, members, of the Armed Forces of the United States stationed in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam Conflict served our Nation under the most trying conditions, at a time when the

Nation was divided in its support; and

Whereas, more than 300,000 service members were wounded in Vietnam; approximately 75,000

service members were severely disabled; and 733 of the Combat losses of the 58,000 Service

members killed, were from the state of West Virginia; and

Whereas, on March 29, 1973, the United States Armed Forces began to withdraw all combat forces

from Vietnam; and

Whereas, since their return, these veterans have contributed tremendously to their communities, states,

and nation, in an effort to advance. The American ideals and goals for which they fought;

and

Whereas, the citizens of West Virginia must never forget the pain and suffering that lingers today for

the men and woman who fought with honor and distinction, and the name of freedom and

democracy for all.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *March 30, 2023* as:

West Virginia Vietnam Veterans Recognition Day

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in this observance.
