Whereas, this enduring partnership has facilitated numerous collaborative initiatives in areas such as business, technology, arts, and environmental stewardship, significantly contributing to global progress and understanding; and

Whereas, it is essential to acknowledge and celebrate the contributions of the Japanese community in West Virginia, which have greatly enriched the cultural fabric of the state; and

Whereas, November 29th marks a significant date in commemorating the longstanding friendship and cooperation between the Great State of West Virginia and Japan, providing an opportunity to honor our shared achievements and reaffirm our commitment to a continued prosperous relationship.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *November 29, 2023* as:

West Virginia-Japan Friendship Day

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to observe this day with appropriate programs, ceremonies, and activities that celebrate and strengthen the bond between West Virginia and Japan.
