AN AMENDED PROCLAMATION

By the Governor

WHEREAS, Hurricane Helene, a significant storm event, with associated high winds occurred which caused flooding, downed trees, power outages, and road blockages, in Mercer County, West Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the effects of the storm pose a severe and continuing threat to the health, safety, welfare, and property of citizens of the State, including Mercer County; and

WHEREAS, it has been deemed necessary and beneficial to declare a State of Emergency, pursuant to West Virginia Code § 15-5-6, for Mercer County of the State of West Virginia to enable the most effective response possible;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM JUSTICE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as the Governor of the State of West Virginia, and in view of the foregoing, do hereby FIND AND DECLARE that a State of Emergency exists in Mercer County, said State of Emergency to remain in effect for thirty days from the declaration of this emergency unless terminated by subsequent Proclamation. In response to this State of Emergency, I have INVOKED the emergency powers set forth in West Virginia Code §15-5-6; UTILIZED the Emergency Operations Plan, as necessary; ORDERED appropriate personnel and resources, as may be deemed necessary, to mobilize and respond to the emergency; and DELEGATED certain administrative powers to the Director of the West Virginia Emergency Management Division, as necessary, to facilitate the provision of essential emergency services.
