Proclamation by Governor Jim Justice

Whereas, millions of Americans are impacted by the hepatitis A virus (HAV), hepatitis B virus (HBV), and hepatitis C virus (HCV), which cause infection to the liver; and

Whereas, in West Virginia, 8,876 new cases of acute and chronic HVC, and 405 new cases of acute and chronic HBV cases are identified; and

Whereas, an estimated 600 infants are born to HCV positive pregnant persons per year in West Virginia and those who contract the virus can be cured at age three to prevent future liver disease; and

Whereas, more than half of people living with viral hepatitis are unaware they are infected, thereby increasing their risk for severe health problems such as cirrhosis, liver cancer, liver transplant, and death; and

Whereas, with immunizations, access to prevention services, and early detection, hepatitis A, B, and C can be prevented, hepatitis B can be treated, and hepatitis C can be cured, saving lives; and

Whereas, the current epidemic of opioid and other substance use in the state is increasing transmission of these viruses that are spread through blood, primarily intravenous, inclusive of intranasal drug use; and

Whereas, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends all individuals over the age of 18 and pregnant women be screened for hepatitis C virus, at-risk populations and all people born in regions of the world where HBV is common be screened for hepatitis B virus, and routine vaccination against hepatitis A and B; and

Whereas, CDC recommends education of the public and professionals on hepatitis prevention, testing, and treatment, treatment of all persons living with chronic hepatitis, and the development of systems to conduct viral hepatitis surveillance.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *May 2024* as:

Hepatitis Awareness Month

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to celebrate and promote the arts and culture in the Mountain State.
