Whereas, 64 million American adults and children are diagnosed with a disability and 4.7 million veterans have a service-related injury; and

Whereas, there are 16,000 service dogs from accredited programs in the United States; and

Whereas, in 1975, Canine Companions created the concept of "service dogs" to assist people with

physical disabilities; and

Whereas, Canine Companions is a nonprofit organization that enhances the lives of people with disabilities by providing expertly-trained service dogs and ongoing support to ensure quality

partnerships; and

Whereas, service dogs empower people with disabilities to lead a life with greater independence; and

Whereas, Canine Companions believes in the joyful, transformative power of the human-canine bond

and the inclusivity of all citizens; and

Whereas, National Service Dog Month aims to educate our community about the benefits of service

dogs and the laws protecting them; and

Whereas, National Service Dog Month is a month-long celebration honoring the hard work and

life-changing impact service dogs make on people with disabilities every day.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *September 2024* as:

National Service Dog Month

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in observance.
