Proclamation by Governor Jim Justice

Whereas, the West Virginia Board of Osteopathy was established in 1923 to provide professional licensing parity with allopathic physicians, and 2024 marks 150 years of osteopathic medicine; and

Whereas,

The Osteopathic profession's history began with the innovative and thoughtful mind of physician Andrew Taylor Still, MD, DO, who, after losing his four children, reevaluated the existing practice of medicine and began setting down the tenets of osteopathic medicine in 1874, changing the trajectory of modern health care delivery; and

Whereas, in 1902, eight physicians formed the WV Society of Osteopathic Medicine, now known as the West Virginia Osteopathic Medical Association, to promote the interests and influence of the Osteopathic profession in West Virginia.; and

Whereas, the unique approach of osteopathic medicine enables DOs to provide patients with the most comprehensive level of care found in medicine today; and

Whereas,
Osteopathic Physicians have made significant contributions to the healthcare system of the United States and play a critical role in public health preparedness and working on the front lines treating patients; and

Whereas, the Osteopathic profession has grown exponentially since its inception to include 41 colleges in 66 locations across 35 states; including the West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine; and

Whereas, the West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine is the largest medical school in WV; and

Whereas, Osteopathic Physicians train and practice in all medical specialties and practice settings, in every State and across international boundaries and now there are now more than 197,000 osteopathic physicians and osteopathic medical students in the United States; and

Whereas, West Virginia's 1,600 osteopathic physicians are dedicated to improving the health of their communities through patient-centered care focused on treating the body, mind, and spirit; and

Whereas, Osteopathic Physicians serve the citizens of West Virginia, in acknowledgement of the need for Physicians who are committed to improving the health of our nation, regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, national origin or citizenship status, sex, gender identity or expression, pregnancy, sexual orientation, age, disability, or military status; and

Whereas, the West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine is the largest medical school in WV; and

Whereas,

The WV Osteopathic Medical Association and the American Osteopathic Association represent the interests of ALL osteopathic physicians licensed in the Great State of West Virginia, regardless of specialty or practice type – ensuring their voice is heard and the public understands the distinctive approach DOs bring to the practice of medicine.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim December 2024 as:

Osteopathic Medicine Month

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in observance recognizing West Virginia's current and future Osteopathic Physicians, the contributions of the WV Osteopathic Medical Association, the American Osteopathic Association, The WV Board of Osteopathic Medicine, and the WV School of Osteopathic Medicine for their roles in ensuring and advancing quality healthcare in our
