A PROCLAMATION

By the Governor

WHEREAS, James Earl Carter, Jr., the thirty-ninth President of the United States of America, passed away, today, December 29, 2024; and

WHEREAS, President Carter was born on October 1, 1924, in Plains, Georgia, and was the son of the late James Earl Carter, Sr. and Bessie Lillian Gordy; and

WHEREAS, President Carter was a man of character, courage, and compassion, whose lifetime of service defined him as one of the most influential statesmen in our history; and

WHEREAS, President Carter was a heroic champion of global peace and human rights, and an honorable leader whose moral clarity and hopeful vision lifted our Nation; and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States of America has directed by proclamation that the flag of the United States shall be flown at half-staff on all public buildings and grounds and other facilities both in the United States and abroad until sunset on the day of interment, as a mark of respect for thirty-ninth President of the United States of America, James Earl Carter, Jr. and his life of service to our Nation.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM JUSTICE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as the Governor of the State of West Virginia, and in keeping with the Presidential Proclamation issued December 29, 2024, do hereby **ORDER** that all United States flags and West Virginia flags displayed on all State-owned facilities throughout West Virginia shall be lowered to half-staff, there to remain until sunset on the day of interment.
