A PROCLAMATION

By the Governor

WHEREAS, numerous forest fires burned across West Virginia beginning Wednesday, March 20, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Eastern Panhandle experienced several fires, with well over 200 acres burring across the region, especially in parts of Grant, Hampshire, Hardy, and Pendleton Counties, posing a threat to the health, safety, welfare, and property of the citizens of West Virginia; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with my authority as Governor, I have declared a State of Emergency for Grant, Hampshire, Hardy, and Pendleton Counties of the State of West Virginia to enable the most effective response possible;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM JUSTICE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as the Governor of the State of West Virginia, and in view of the foregoing, do hereby FIND AND DECLARE that a State of Emergency exists in Grant, Hardy, Hampshire, and Pendleton Counties, said State of Emergency to remain in effect for thirty days unless terminated by subsequent Proclamation. In response to this State of Emergency, I have INVOKED the emergency powers set forth in West Virginia Code §15-5-6; UTILIZED the Emergency Operations Plan, as necessary; ORDERED appropriate personnel and resources, as may be deemed necessary, to mobilize and respond to the emergency; and DELEGATED certain administrative powers to the Director of the West Virginia Emergency Management Division, as necessary, to facilitate the provision of essential emergency services.
