AN AMENDED PROCLAMATION

By the Governor

WHEREAS, beginning on the April 2, 2024, a severe thunderstorm with associated high winds occurred which caused flooding, downed trees, power outages, and road blockages, in certain counties all over the State; and

WHEREAS, the effects of the storm pose a severe and continuing threat to the health, safety, welfare, and property of citizens of the State, including Pleasants County; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with my authority as Governor, I and including Pleasants County in the State of Emergency declared on April 2, 2024;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM JUSTICE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as the Governor of the State of West Virginia, and in view of the foregoing, do hereby FIND AND DECLARE that a State of Emergency exists and continues in Barbour, Fayette, Hancock, Kanawha, Lincoln, Marshall, Nicholas, Ohio, Pleasants and Wetzel Counties, said State of Emergency to remain in effect for thirty days from the declaration of this emergency unless terminated by subsequent Proclamation. In response to this State of Emergency, I have INVOKED the emergency powers set forth in West Virginia Code §15-5-6; UTILIZED the Emergency Operations Plan, as necessary; ORDERED appropriate personnel and resources, as may be deemed necessary, to mobilize and respond to the emergency; and DELEGATED certain administrative powers to the Director of the West Virginia Emergency Management Division, as necessary, to facilitate the provision of essential emergency services.
