A PROCLAMATION

By the Governor

WHEREAS, Charles Gilliam was born on the third day of March, Nineteen Hundred Twenty-nine, in Culver, Kentucky, the son of Mertie and Esther Williams Gilliam; and

WHEREAS, Charles Gilliam moved to West Virginia in Nineteen Hundred Thirty-three and attended Logan County Schools; and

WHEREAS, Charles Gilliam joined the United States Army during the Korean War, later joining the United States Marine Corp and achieved the rank of Master Sergeant in the National Guard during the Cuban Missile Crisis; and

WHEREAS, Charles Gilliam served in the House of Delegates representing the Sixteenth District of Logan and Lincoln Counties for Sixteen years starting in Nineteen Hundred Seventyone; and

WHEREAS, Charles Gilliam retired from the Pittston Coal Group with Forty-eight years of service and was a member of the U.M.W.A.; and


WHEREAS, Delegate Charles Gilliam, a committed and respected public servant and a
